August 1, 2019 marks the start of our new grant cycle, year 1 of 6! Now that MMCORC Cancer Care Delivery Research (CCDR) program has established a strong foundation; our work continues enrolling patients, providers, and health systems to Care Delivery (CD) research protocols.

Measurement of our success as a consortium

Traditionally CCDR has focused on patients. Now that the **National Cancer Institute (NCI)** has expanded the focus of CCDR trials to include caregivers, families, clinicians and practice settings our enrolling participant accrual has evolved to include Patients, Providers and Health Systems. *Learn more at: https://youtu.be/zh4OQG1Wzmc*

MMCORC CCDR accrual over the past quarter (May, June & July 2019) included 9 patients, 88 multi-disciplinary providers of cancer care and 19 health systems. Contributors to this data included collaboration with 6 Pathology leaders and 3 Pharmacy leaders. **The NCI aims to identify activities and approaches to cancer care that can be changed quickly and immediately improve care.**




Figure: MMCORC CCDR accrual last quarter GY 5 of 5 (May, June & July 2019)
